

Scheduling Your Classes

- In-person format (TUG)
- Full time (12-18 credits) vs Part time (less than 12 credits)
- All courses count toward the minimum 120 hours required for graduation
- School/Life Balance
 - Athletics
 - Employment (on- and off-campus)
 - Internships
- Drop vs. Withdrawal
 - Add/Drop runs until Tuesday, 1/18 at 4pm
 - Withdrawal deadline: Wednesday, 3/23 at 4pm
 - See your advisor if you need to make a change to your course schedule


- Updating/confirming emergency contact information must be done once a year, per federal guidelines.

- To get started, click on your name on the top right hand corner and scroll down to emergency information






- If you have not added an emergency contact yet, you will need to click on the "Add New Contact Button"
- You can also edit or delete previous contacts by clicking on the blue icons






- You will need to enter a name and one phone number

until this step is completed.








The "timeline" tab provides a snapshot of transfer credit and shows classes registered/completed by semester.


