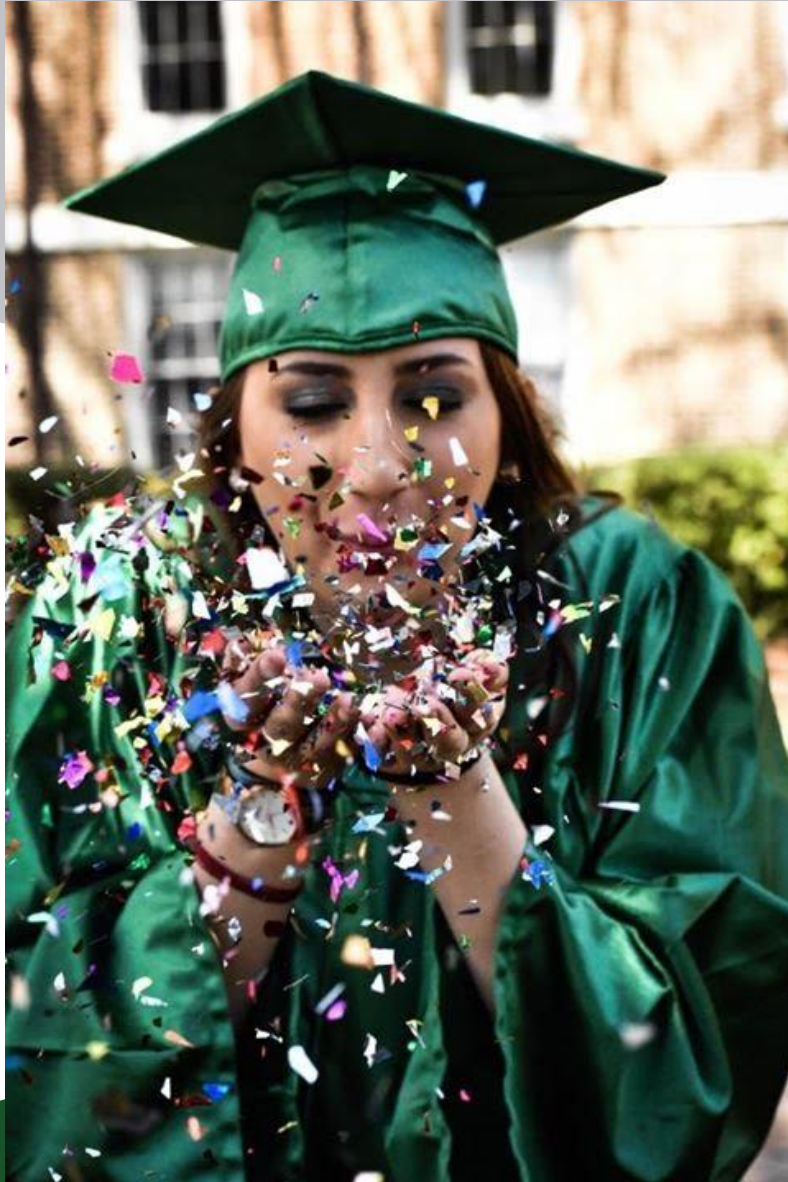

# General Electives

- A great way to explore other subject areas
- Number of required elective credits depends on the major
- Many students use electives for a minor



# Scheduling Your Classes

- In-person format (TUG)
- Full time (**12–18 credits**) vs Part time (less than 12 credits)
- All courses count toward the minimum 120 hours required for graduation
- School/Life Balance
  - Athletics
  - Employment (on- and off-campus)
  - Internships
- Drop vs. Withdrawal
  - Add/Drop runs until Tuesday, 1/18 at 4pm
  - Withdrawal deadline: Wednesday, 3/23 at 4pm
  - See your advisor if you need to make a change to your course schedule

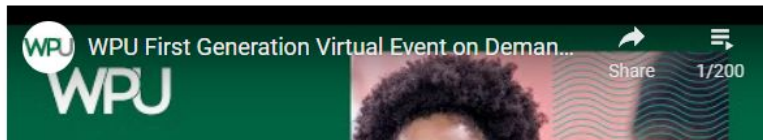

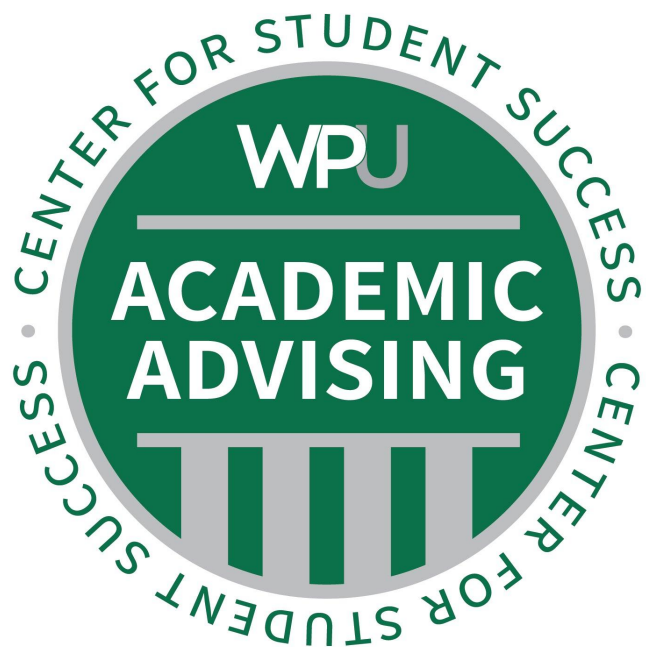

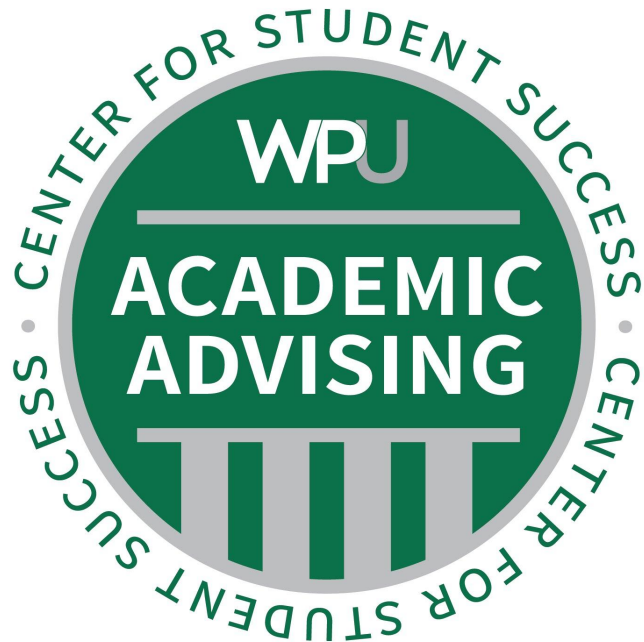
