A DISABILITY IS "A PHYSICAL OR MENTAL IMPAIRMENT THAT SUBSTANTIALLY LIMITS ONE OR MORE LIFE ACTIVITIES" SUCH AS LEARNING, WORKING, WALKING, SEEING, OR HEARING

Examples of disabilities include:

- ADHD
- Vision loss or blindness
- Hearing loss or deafness
- Physical or mobility impairments
- Learning disabilities
- Medical conditions
- Psychiatric diagnoses
- Developmental disabilities

STUDENTS HAVE THE RIGHT TO PRIVACY AND THE RESPONSIBILITY TO DISCLOSE THEIR LEARNING DIFFERENCES TO A DISABILITY SERVICES COUNSELOR

- Students who are interested in registering with Disability Services must make an appointment with a Disability Services staff person at the beginning of each academic year in order to write a current academic accommodation plan
- Students must submit appropriate documentation to qualify for services

Health Services offers free and confidential treatment to all traditional undergraduate students (commuter students will be charged a small fee). Our experienced staff provides routine exams, treatment for minor illnesses and injuries, and health education in various forms.

SERVICES INCLUDE:

- Treatment of minor illnesses (cold, sore throat)
- Over the counter medications
- Strep, mono, glucose, and pregnancy Free and confidential STD testing testing
- Urinalysis
- Nutrition advice and weight monitoring

FOUR (4) REQUIREMENTS FOR YOUR MEDICAL RECORD:

- 1. Completed Vital Health Record (due by orientation)
- 2. Results of a recent (within the last year) physical (due by first day of classes)
- 3. Physical form and immunization checklist, found on Magnus Health
- 4. A copy of your complete childhood immunizations (due by first day of classes)

ALL MEDICAL DOCUMENTATION MUST BE UPLOADED OR FAXED TO YOUR ELECTRONIC MEDICAL RECORD ON MAGNUS HEALTH, WITH THE COVER SHEET INCLUDED.
